

## Watercolor Painting 101 & 102 – Alex Hagerty

## Materials List

- You can buy materials online at places like Michaels, Blick, Jerry's Artarama, and Amazon. You can also buy them in person at places like Michaels or Hobby Lobby.
- \*Click <u>here</u> for the link to products for convenience, but you're free to use what you have or buy from somewhere else! \*
  - 1. Sketchbook/drawing paper: any blank paper type is fine, just for sketching ideas!
  - 2. Watercolor paints: can be liquid tubes or solid pans (colors to look for: Cadmium Red, Cadmium Yellow, Ultramarine Blue, Phthalo Blue, Burnt Sienna, Alizarin Crimson, Burnt Umber, Permanent Rose, Sap Green)
  - Link to Liquid Tubes Set
  - Link to Solid Pan Set
  - 3. Watercolor Brushes, preferably Rounds: 1 small, 1 medium & 1 large plus 1 Lg Wash brush
  - Link to Brush Set
  - 4. Watercolor paper: (I like Strathmore, Canson, or Arches brand)
  - Link to Arches Paper
  - Link to Strathmore Paper
  - 5. Mixing palette: white plastic, medium, with medium sized mixing wells for mixing colors
  - Link to Mixing Palette
  - 6. Pencil
  - 7. Pencil Sharpener
  - 8. Eraser
  - 9. Ruler
  - 10. Plastic containers for water (ex. Cleaned out Yogurt Cup or Sour Cream Container, Lightweight plastic cup)
  - 11. Rag (We have paper towels in the classroom but bringing your own rag can prevent waste)
  - 12. Masking tape or Washi tape
  - Link to Washi Tape

## **Optional Materials**

Optional: Medium-sized board for taping down watercolor sheets to prevent buckling &
distortion - (such as hard cardboard, foam board, lightweight wood/particle board) \*\*You can
also press paper with a book after its dry to get the same effect
